Message from the Principal and Chair of Calrossy Board

Calrossy Anglican School has been a significant part of the Tamworth and Northern NSW educational landscape for over one hundred years. It has grown from being a small girls school in 1919 to what it is today; a multi-campus and complex Regional Boarding school, making a valuable contribution to the education of young Australians, achieving positive outcomes for students in every area of school life.

Calrossy has endured world wars, floods and droughts and significant societal change as Tamworth has developed around it. In more recent times the merger with William Cowper Anglican Schools, has allowed our transformation as a contemporary coeducational day and boarding school for boys and girls from Prep to Year 12, now enrolling over 1000 students. Notably the school has demonstrated during its rich history a capacity to innovate and adapt to meet the needs of young people during each period. However, it has never lost sight of the original vision of the school or the purpose of developing young women and men of character and substance, willing to give anything a go and working together to achieve positive outcomes in every aspect of school life. What has stood out are important features that are inherent to the school, in the past and continuing;

- The ability to adapt and respond to the needs of students
- Producing graduates with courage and determination who make a difference, at school and beyond

Learning in Partnership


